This segment will showcase best practices in products, public policy, residential retrofitting programs, and private market incentivization efforts for fundamentals of "Resilience for Existing Residential Construction."

Featured topics include:

- State Insurance Commissioners aka Resilience Leaders Brian Powell, NAIC Catastrophe Risk Mitigation Specialist, will moderate a panel of state insurance commissioners who are leading by example and leaning in on resilience. These leaders will share how they have created mitigation grant programs to upgrade homes built to older construction standards, serving as a catalyst for a culture of resilience and addressing insurance marketplace challenges as well.
- *Growing the "Build" Team* Natalie Enclade, BuildStrong America Executive Director, will lead a panel discussion of programs and incentives to expand our nation's corps of retrofitters who specialize in the specific techniques that make homes ready for disasters of all kinds.
- Incentivize but Verify This dialogue will focus on modern and emerging methods for home inspections, code enforcement, and incentive verification for resilient construction. The facilitator will host an audience dialogue aimed at creating a common scorecard, system, or other method to achieve scale for verifiable, resilient homes that can be considered for banking, insurance, real estate, or other types of benefits.

Shiny New Product Solutions – This session will focus on innovative new products, systems, or
other solutions to help homeowners upgrade their homes to a more resilient state. The presenters
will focus on affordable, achievable "hacks" to help owners and renters achieve the "DREAM"
home of the future while dispelling myths and opening doors to new ideas.

• *Shiny New Communication Solutions* – This session will focus on innovative new, research-informed assets, digital tools, and programs to support attendees' risk communication efforts.

Following the presentation, 2025 National Weatherperson of the Year and former National Hurricane Center Director Bill Read will join past NHC Directors for this dialogue to explore signature voices for resilience and how they have accelerated past initiatives, including "Turn Around, Don't Drown!" "#HurricaneStrong" and more.
- Designing the Future: What's Next, What's Needed? This final session will include a facilitated, two-way attendee engagement session and luncheon to finalize the NDRC2025 Vision for the Dream Home of the Future. The vision will be captured and published as the NDRC2025 outcome and statement, and all attendees will have the opportunity to sign on as supporters of the collectively created vision.
