Spotlight Presentation & Interview: *Moving Past FEMA Flood Maps: Enhancing Public Understanding Through Improved Risk Communication Strategies*

Flood maps remain among the most widely used tools for communicating flood risk, yet research shows that many homeowners struggle to understand and act on the information they provide. In this session, the presenter will share findings from focus groups and a multi-state survey of more than 1,200 participants examining how consumers perceive flood risk, where they seek information, and which communication approaches are most effective in motivating preparedness.

This session will allow attendees to explore common misconceptions about flood insurance and disaster assistance, barriers to protective action, and emerging strategies that emphasize clearer, localized, and more actionable messaging delivered through trusted sources. Additionally, the presentation will highlight how [Inspect2Protect.org](https://inspect2protect.org) and other consumer-facing resources resonated with survey participants regarding competence and confidence.
